A big welcome to our new students!

Tohoku University actively recommends that students participate in extracurricular activities to develop their social skills, independence, and leadership abilities.

Besides academics, Tohoku University offers the Gakuyu-kai (Students' Friendship Association), an organization that oversees voluntary student activities related to culture, sports, and more. There are about 200 cultural and sports organizations in the Gakuyu-kai.

These organizations hold various explanations, performances and presentations, especially at the beginning of the term when new students arrive. The Gakuyu-kai holds other functions too, such as Homecoming.

New students are encouraged to actively participate in events held by the Gakuyu-kai and any clubs/circles they find interesting for their own enjoyment and enrichment.



The Seven Universities Athletic Meet (Nanadaisen)

The "Nanadaisen" is a yearly athletic competition between Hokkaido University, Tohoku University, University of Tokyo, Nagoya University, Kyoto University, Osaka University, and Kyushu University. Tohoku University will host the 61st competition next year, so events will be held in locations around Miyagi prefecture.

This will be the first time in 2 years that the competition will be held. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, only 3 winter events were held at the 59th competition at Osaka University, and the 60th competition at Kyoto University was canceled.

The 61st competition will begin with 2 winter events (ice hockey and skiing; aviation was canceled) from December to March, and continue with 40 summer events from June to September. Points are awarded to universities depending on their results in each event, with the university that earns the most total points declared the winner.

Tohoku University has won the competition a total of 15 times, winning 6 of the last 10 competitions. Before the event was suspended two years ago, Tohoku University had won three consecutive competitions (56th-58th), so we hope to make the 61st competition our 4th straight win.

We wish the best of luck to all of the competitors! We hope that all of you will join us in cheering on Tohoku University's athletes too!

Theft/Lost & Found/Alcohol/Illegal Bicycle Parking

Lost & Found

The university receives many inquiries from people who are looking for lost items, or have found a lost item.

If possible, **attach name labels** to your possessions so that if you lose them they can be quickly returned to you. **Put a distinguishing feature (such as a unique keychain or sticker)** on your bicycle/apartment keys etc. so you can easily tell them apart from those of others.



Theft

Please be extra careful with your bicycle and other valuables.

Taking a few precautions, such as putting two locks on your bicycle and not leaving your belongings unattended, can deter theft.

Alcohol

As of April 1, 2022, the age of adulthood will be lowered to 18 in Japan. Even so, persons under the age of 20 will not be allowed to drink alcohol or use tobacco products. If you are under 20, please do not drink or smoke, regardless of the situation.



Illegal Parking

We have received many complaints from business owners about students improperly using customer-only parking areas. Do not illegally park bicycles/vehicles or park them in places that inconvenience others. Please be considerate and use a designated public parking area instead.
